In developing Keystone Taranaki, a project plan to deliver essential capacity and support for voluntary and community organisations, the Bishop's Action Foundation identified a number of key deliverables that included training; leadership development; a critical friends programme for mentoring capacity building support and advice; and a community sector ICT project – the ICT Gateway.

The ICT Gateway is an initiative to support IT and Communication innovation within the voluntary and community sector. By providing a range of good practice resources and guidance, the ICT Gateway aims to support organisations to improve strategic planning and management of ICT technologies; help access expertise and hardware resources; and to work collaboratively with each other to maximise the benefits offered by changing ICT technology. Since completing their own upgrade project the ICT Gateway initiative has provided various ICT solutions for other organisations such as; New Plymouth Cancer Society, New Plymouth YMCA, Pregnancy Help (National) and New Plymouth Women's refuge.
