

Microsoft Office 365 and Microsoft 365

Office 365 can provide you and your staff with:

- The latest Office desktop applications for PC and Mac
- Cloud-based access to Office applications
- Hosted email and calendars with Exchange Online
- Instant messaging and web and video conferencing through Microsoft Teams
- Access to your documents from anywhere with **OneDrive for Business**
- Collaborate on and manage shared documents and information with SharePoint Online

Zoom

Zoom Meetings software does exactly what it says on the tin:

- run video conferences, presentations and webinars
- share your screen and chat with colleagues
- Easily invite guests to join (you can password protect your rooms)
- Runs on desktop and mobile

Pay an admin fee and get 50% off of Zoom's current rates for their Pro (max 9 hosts) or Business (max 49 hosts) plans if you're a Connecting Up member. TechSoup NZ members have access to this too; the Pro link is here and the Business link is here.

Google for Nonprofits

Google's non-profit cloud offer includes:

- Google G-Suite basic, with hosted email, cloud file storage with Google Drive, online messaging and conferencing with Google Hangouts
- \$10,000 USD/month of in-kind advertising for text ads through Google's AdWords program
- YouTube non-profit account
- Google Maps platform credits

Asana

Asana is online collaborative work management software that helps teams coordinate and manage their work.

You can use Asana to project manage, make a personal to-do list, conduct team chats, stick to deadlines, monitor team workload, and much more.

Pay and admin fee and get 50% off of either the Premium or Business plans (min. 5 users). Check out the savings table here if you're a Connecting Up member and here if you're a member of TechSoup NZ.



Box

Dedicated online file-sharing application. Store documents and sensitive information in the cloud and easily share with both colleagues and external users as necessary.

Box integrates with Office 365, Google Docs, Salesforce and more. For those with requirements for Australian data residency, Box have you covered (unfortunately not NZ at this time).

You can get a perpetual, 10-user licence for \$127 ex GST AUD or \$140 ex GST NZD

Slack

Slack is a team messaging tool and collaboration tool. You can chat with people in shared channels, directly or in ad-hoc groups. You can also make calls, share files and it integrates with other tools like Zoom and Google Docs.

Slack is easy to pick up and is a great tool for having a quick and productive conversation (or for sharing jokes!).

Slack have a non-profit offer that you can request through them directly <u>here</u>.



TeamViewer


Need to provide IT support remotely? TeamViewer is a well-known remote-access tool which can help you troubleshoot technical issues your colleagues might be having and let you control their PC without you having to be there with them.

It also includes online meeting tools (albeit somewhat more limited in scope, 5 users max).

TeamViewer have both a donated and discounted offer.

Connecting Up members can access a TeamViewer licence for \$89 ex GST <u>here</u> and the discounted offers here.

For TechSoup NZ members, the donated offer is \$99 ex GST and the discounted offers are here.



Anything else?

There are plenty of other online or cloud-based applications available through the program. While these aren't necessarily 'team-based' applications like the above, they may still prove useful for the remote worker.


